Interested in running for City Council?

To get your name on the ballot you need to fill out an Affidavit of Candidacy and collect at least 10 signatures on a Nomination Petition, both forms can be found online at: sos.iowa.gov/city-elections.

To qualify you must be 1. A citizen of the United States 2. A resident of Iowa (and in Alexander City limits) 3. At least 18 years old.

May not 1. Be a convicted felon (unless voting rights have been restored by the president or governor) 2. Be currently judged incompetent to vote by a court. 3. Claim the right to vote in any other place.

Turn in your notarized Nomination Papers to the City Clerk starting Monday, August 25, 2025. Deadline is 5:00 PM on September 18, 2025.
