Mayor Schear opened the meeting at 6:00 PM.  
 Council Persons Present: Roy Arends, Brad Peterson, Courtney Noelting, and Kim Larsen.  
 Approval of Agenda – Motion by Larsen to approve, 2nd by Noelting. Approved unanimously.  
 Minutes of October meeting – Motion by Arends to approve, 2nd by Peterson. Approved unanimously.  
 Motion by Noelting to approve vouchers and pay bills, 2nd by K Larsen. Approved unanimously.  
 November Expenditures – IPERS (pensions) \$324.37; Router12 (phone/internet) \$80.00; S&H Environmental (Water Super) \$850.00; Treas St IA (WET) \$187.87; Aimee Frohling (clerk salary/mileage) \$890.96; Christian Larsen (Maint/Wat Ass./Roads) \$865.76; Thomas Schear (Mayor) \$46.12.  
 October Receipts – Property Tax \$20,194.68; LOST \$1,707.83; Road Use Taxes \$1,468.59; Utility Accounts \$4,112.88.  
 Public Input – Clerk received a complaint prior to the council meeting about the Mayor's behavior at the election precinct. Council acknowledged.

Library Report – Santa Day and Holiday open house is scheduled for December 13th with help from the Franklin County 4H.

Water Dept Report – Christian Larsen presented, Mort's coming on Friday to fix water leak and also replace a check valve that is back feeding. Flushed hydrants last month, cleanest he's ever seen, hasn't had any complaints in a long time about water quality, thinks they just weren't being flushed at all before.

Snow Plow Fuel – Dudley's is closing the end of the year and that's where we had an account for diesel, Christian will make sure the truck is full before they close, but wondering where to go after they close if someone hasn't bought it and reopened. Arends has diesel and will sell to the City if need be for this season. Last year the City only spent \$82 on snow plow fuel, so it may not be necessary. Will re-evaluate next year.

Street Finance Report – Clerk presented to council, answered questions. Discussed getting an estimate for paving the rest of Harriman Street. Would like clerk to send email to owner of the apartments that the trench across the alley needs to be cemented, he will be billed for damages if the snow plow is damaged.

Compensation and Bonuses – A couple of suggestions made, council will contemplate until next meeting.

**Building Permits**
